Faith grows here

Easter is Coming!

As we journey deeper into Lent, I find myself reflecting on this season's call to repentance. Much more than simply refraining from sinful behavior or feeling sorry about our shortcomings, true repentance involves a total reorientation of one's life toward God. The Greek word translated as repentance is *metanoia*, which literally means "to change one's mind." So repentance necessitates a change of perspective, a reversal of the way we might normally look at the world. A poem by a teacher of mine, Dr. David Lose, shows what this reversal sounds like. I share it with you now to point us toward the hope of what is to come in the promise of Easter.

In Christ, Pr. Drew

Easter is coming.

But for many of us, this is not the ultimate reality.

There is too much pain and suffering in the world today.

Death has the last word.

It would therefore be foolish to say that the life and death of a first-century Jew named Jesus makes a difference.

Why?

Might makes right. Power is superior to compassion. And despair is stronger than hope.

So I refuse to believe a man can come back from the dead.

Sometimes the most important facts are the hardest to accept.

Resurrection is a false hope.

How can you say an empty tomb changes everything?

Don't you see? "God loves the world" is a lie.

Money is God, and the one who dies with the most toys wins.

I will tell you what I will tell my children:

There is no more to this world than what you can see, hold, and buy.

There is no mystery in everyday life,

and there is nothing sacred about ordinary things and people.

Many of us simply do not believe that God can give life to the dead, bring light from darkness, and create something out of nothing.

But what if the testimony of the women at the tomb was true?

Then...

God *can* give life to the dead, bring light from darkness, and create something out of nothing.

I will tell you what I will tell my children:

"The one who dies with the most toys wins" and "Money is God" is a lie.

How can you say resurrection is a false hope?

Sometimes the most important facts are the hardest to accept.

A man *can* come back from the dead.

So I refuse to believe despair is stronger than hope, power is superior to compassion, and might makes right.

Why?

The life and death of a first-century Jew named Jesus makes a difference.

It would therefore be foolish to say that Death has the last word.

There *is* too much pain and suffering in the world today.

But for many of us, this is not the ultimate reality.

Facilities Coordinator

We are accepting applicants for the part-time position of Facilities Coordinator. This position performs routine cleaning, set-up and tear down for various activities and events, and ensures a safe and presentable environment. This position is responsible for the upkeep and basic maintenance of the church facilities and grounds, coordinating with contractors on further repairs, maintenance, and projects.

Qualifications include:

- High School Diploma or equivalent
- 1-2 years' experience or education in cleaning, building maintenance, or facility repairs. Prefer experience with basic plumbing, electrical, and HVAC systems.
- Basic computer skills including email.
- Ability to push, pull, lift, carry up to 50 lbs. occasionally, and 30 lbs. frequently.

This is a part-time position, working 25-28 hours per week. Schedule is typically Monday-Friday with occasional nights and weekends. Starting pay range is \$17-\$19/hour, based on experience. This position is eligible for the following benefits: vacation, sick time, and holiday pay.

Business Administrator

We are accepting applicants for the part-time position of Business Administrator. This is an integral role to the overall operations of the church.

This position manages the business operations of the church, implementing and overseeing financial, human resources, and general operations to achieve our mission objectives. This role partners with our Pastors, staff, council, and committees, on budgeting, contracting and service needs, and analysis and reporting.

We are seeking:

- Intermediate experience in Microsoft Word, Excel, and email.
- Demonstrated experience in financial management, budget oversight, and reporting.
- Prefer working knowledge of human resources policies, laws and benefits.
- Analytical, problem-solving, and decision-making skills.
- Availability to attend meetings outside of regular working hours, as needed.

This is a part-time position, working 25 hours per week. Some flexibility in selecting hours and days scheduled. This position is eligible for the following benefits: vacation, sick leave, and holiday pay.

Open roles at Our Savior's are getting to be fewer, but we do still have an opening for a Business Administrator and Facilities Coordinator. If you know of a great candidate, again, please share their name with a staff or Council member and we would be happy to reach out to them!

While spring is just around the corner... maybe... we revisited the winter closure policy. When school is canceled, so is our programming. The church office will remain open. For Sunday Worship, a decision will be made by 7:00 a.m. Notifications will be sent out by mass email and text messaging.

A grant was approved for the Faribault Elementary School PTO group's. This will allow all elementary school students the chance to experience the world around them through field trips and school affiliated activities.

Lastly, Evon Ask was a special guest at the meeting. She shared with us her childhood story about giving. She is very passionate about benevolence and wants to see Our Savior's give personally in a way that our budget can not. She would love to implement a "Buck Bucket" or "Blessing Bucket." She said "You give because you are already blessed." We talked about ways that we already give as a congregation, and will continue to discuss this, along with the implementation of our new lead pastor, the formation of a Stewardship Team, and Spring Table.


