Dear friends in Christ,

This last month I've been blessed to sit down with many of you in our "Come & See" conversations. Time and time again, I've heard a beautiful thread running through your stories: I came here because someone noticed me. Whether it was a warm greeting from a pastor, a smile from someone in the pew, or a kind word during coffee hour, what stuck wasn't just the worship service—it was the relationship.

That kind of noticing? That's holy.

In Luke 19, as Jesus is entering Jericho, He notices someone no one else wants to see. Zacchaeus is up in a tree—literally out on a limb—hoping just to catch a glimpse of Jesus. And what happens? Jesus sees him. Really sees him. He doesn't just wave and move on. He stops. He speaks. He calls Zacchaeus by name. He goes to his house. He build's a relationship.

That's the kind of noticing that transforms.

And that same Spirit is alive here at Our Savior's. But it takes all of us. Greeting people. Inviting them. Noticing when someone is sitting alone. And yes—even gasp—changing pews!

I know, I know. That's probably the most un-Lutheran thing I've ever suggested. But hear me out: relationships don't grow if we only sit by the people we already know. So try it. One Sunday, switch things up. Sit on the other side of the sanctuary. You might feel a little disoriented (and your pew might feel abandoned), but you also might meet someone whose story you've never heard.

Say hi. Ask a question. Share a laugh. Sit together at fellowship hour. Offer to pray for someone. And if you notice a new face in worship—be the first to extend a hand and a smile.

Jesus didn't just preach to crowds. He noticed people. And when we do the same, we're not just being friendly—we're being faithful.

Dancing in the Darkness

Rev. Dr. Otis Moss III tells a powerful story to open his book Dancing in the Darkness: Spiritual Lessons for Thriving in Turbulent Times. In 2008 he was serving as a pastor at Trinity United Church of Christ in Chicago. It just so happened that this was the congregation where then senator Barak Obama was a member. Obama had recently begun his campaign to run for president, and a wave of threats and hate speech began to pour into the church. Some of these threats were targeted at the pastors and their families. The church had to hire bomb-sniffing dogs and round-the-clock security. Pr. Moss was even forced to have a "shadow" for each of his children to keep an eye on them while at school. It was a time of great stress and tension for them, and Pr. Moss, understandably, was not getting much sleep.

Late one night Pr. Moss awoke to a noise somewhere inside the house. His wife urged him to check it out, so he grabbed his "rod and staff which comfort me – that being my Louisville Slugger baseball bat," and went to investigate. Walking carefully into the dark hallway, he heard the noise again and this time realized it was coming from his five-year-old daughter's bedroom. Fear gripped him. Opening the door, Pr. Moss saw his little girl in the middle of her bedroom, twirling in circles. "Look daddy! I'm dancing!"

It was 3am and Pr. Moss was scheduled to preach in just a few hours. Relieved but also exhausted and perhaps a bit impatient, he said, "Baby, it is 3am, it is time to go to bed." But she kept twirling and saying, "Look daddy, I'm dancing!" And before he could use his authoritative, fatherly voice again, the Spirit spoke to him: "Stop. Look at your daughter. She is dancing in the darkness. The darkness is around her. But the darkness is not in her." Pr. Moss scrapped the sermon he had planned to deliver and worked until the sun rose preparing a new message about how we must learn to dance in the darkness.

I know many of you sense that darkness surrounds us. Even though we are in the season of Easter and the dark days of winter are giving way to the brightness and warmth of Spring, we feel the weight of conflicts around the world, economic uncertainty and political turmoil at home, and the many challenges we face in our own communities and families. Like Pr. Moss gripping his bat, we may face threats that are very real and clutch things that can give us a sense of security. The question is, how can we recognize the darkness around us, but not let it inside of us? How do we hold onto the inner light which Christ has given us? How can we learn to dance in the darkness? I suspect the answer to that question will be different for each of you, but I think a key for all of us is joy. We can resist the darkness by holding onto that which gives us joy.

The darkness can feel overwhelming when we realize we have no guarantees for how things will go. But if we stay grounded in the present moment, and stay connected to that which gives us life, joy will find us, and we will not be overcome. After all, the darkness of the tomb could not overcome Jesus. Our lives are united with the crucified and resurrected life of Christ, and it's in Christ that we live and move and have our being.


Graduation Sunday






An Invitation to Share Flowers for the Altar
