Dear friends in Christ,

Beloved Community: Being a beloved community means coming together in unity, love, and respect for one another. It means creating a space where all are welcomed, valued, and heard. This is something that I strive for when I think of the community of Our Savior's. Through forums, book studies, and dialogue, all people are going to be invited to explore what it truly means to be a beloved community in our context. We will look at what extending hospitality and showing genuine care for each other looks like. While digging in together, I hope we will better define who we are as a church and how we can live out our values in community with others.

Beloved Community is kicking off this month and I am thrilled to share with you an exciting development that recently took place at the Synod Assembly of the South East Minnesota Synod. Three resolutions were passed! One of which emphasizes the importance of lifting up the stories of women in the Bible through preaching and teaching. This resolution is a significant step towards ensuring that all voices and perspectives in scripture are heard and celebrated.

As a member of a women clergy group, I had the privilege of being a part of the process that led to this resolution. We drew inspiration from the ELCA social statement "Faith, Sexism, and Justice: a call to action," which highlights the need for gender equality and inclusivity within the church. In traditional worship scriptures, many of the voices and stories of women in the Bible are not told. This resolution calls worship leaders to seek out the stories and share them. By committing to preaching and teaching the stories of women in scripture, we are honoring the diverse voices and experiences that make up our faith tradition.

I am excited to bring this resolution to our congregation and invite you to join me in exploring the rich and diverse characters in the Bible. Pastor Drew and I are committed to seek out commentaries and resources written by women, depart from commonly used lectionaries if necessary, and share our learnings with one another, which is what the resolution calls for. Together, we can create a more inclusive and empowering space for all members of our community.

I pray that you will be engaged in this process as well. Come with open hearts to hear the full spectrum of voices in scripture.

Beloved Community and the Least of These

Most of us have at least a passing familiarity with Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s "I Have a Dream" speech. Far fewer are familiar with MLK's concept of "the beloved community," which is arguably the most central idea of his philosophy and what animated his preaching, teaching, and work for civil rights.

In the beloved community, conflicts are resolved peacefully, and adversaries are reconciled through a mutual commitment to understanding, respect, and goodwill. Dr. King believed poverty, hunger, and homelessness would not be tolerated in such a community because human decency would not allow it. An all-inclusive spirit of siblinghood would replace racism and all forms of discrimination, bigotry, and prejudice. In Dr. King's beloved community, compassion and care for the vulnerable are not acts of charity but responsibilities of justice. And the means to achieve this community must always be through nonviolence. Of course, these ideas were not conjured out of thin air, they are deeply rooted in the biblical witness and the ministry and teaching of Jesus himself.

At our synod's annual assembly this past May, several resolutions were considered, voted on, and adopted. One of them, entitled "Support for the Least of These and the Ministries that Serve Them," reminds us of the core message of love and justice that Jesus preached and lived. It reads, in part, "WHEREAS Jesus himself instructs us to show our neighbor mercy (Luke 6:36, 10:29-37) and calls us especially to care for the marginalized and the "least of these" (Matthew 25:31-46), including the sick, the hungry, the thirsty, the homeless, the imprisoned, and the stranger; WHEREAS we are called in our baptism "to serve all people, following the example of Jesus," and "to strive for justice and peace in all the earth (Evangelical Lutheran Worship pp 228), be it RESOLVED, that we as the Southeastern Minnesota Synod of the ELCA affirm our commitment to living out our baptismal vocation in daily life; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we commit ourselves to standing up for the rights and dignity of all God's beloved children, especially for our siblings of color, our queer and transgender siblings, our migrant and refugee siblings, our hungry and thirsty siblings and those experiencing homelessness, our siblings with disabilities, and all our siblings whose rights are being threatened; and we commit ourselves to speaking out against discrimination and prejudice in all places and all ways."

How might we respond to what this resolution calls for? How do we envision what our care and advocacy for the least of these is lived out in and through Our Savior's Lutheran Church? How might the Holy Spirit be moving us toward embodying the beloved community that Dr. King spoke of and that Jesus embodied? These are some of the questions Pr. Kira and I want to wonder about with all of you. So we're inviting you into several opportunities to do just that, including the Beloved Community Forums taking place on July 13 and July 20 (see the ad elsewhere for details).

My hope is that through dialogue and listening, with each other, with scripture, with the Holy Spirit, and with the world, we can discern a faithful path forward. Silence is not an option. The world is hungry for justice, and our neighbors need to hear our voice of compassion and solidarity. Please join me in praying for God's guidance in this holy work.

COUNCIL CORNER

The Church Council met on Tuesday, June 17th. Some of the highlights of our meeting include:

For the remainder of the year, Council will be reading "Anatomy of a Revived Church," and using that as a foundation for considering the direction of the church moving forward.

There are lots of things going on with youth programming! The North Carolina Mission trip wrapped on Monday, June 16, six Confirmation students went to Good Earth Village this past week, Wild Wednesdays are available throughout the summer and VBS is right around the corner. This fall, kids from PreK to 5th grade will be given two options for Education, either after church 10:45 to 11:30 or Wednesday programming. Both times will cover the same material. Please use the QR codes in the bulletins, newsletters and emails to register for upcoming opportunities and events including the Summer Family Fun Days

At the end of May, the Finance Committee conducted a review of the 2024 finances. Their report indicates that the checks and balances that have been enacted over the last few years have been closely followed, and all records and matters were found to be in order. Thank you to the OSLC staff for being so diligent in following these procedures as well.

Council voted to approve two grants that will supplement the Noisy Offering. The first is for Rotary International's efforts to eradicate polio. Dr. Huston has already generously offered a matching \$1,000 gift. The grant approved would activate once the \$1,000 threshold is met, matching the amount collected over \$1,000 dollar for dollar up to \$1,000, meaning a potential \$4,000 going towards the efforts to eradicate polio once and for all. We also approved a 2 to 1 "School Supplies for All" grant to support our local schools. During the months of July and August, the noisy offering will go to help supply our local schools and students with necessary supplies. If the noisy offering collects \$1,667 through July and August, the grant will add \$3,333 for a total \$5,000 donation.

Pastor Kira and Pastor Drew will be presenting and discussing Resolutions passed at the recent Synod Assembly after worship on July 13 and 20. Please join us as you are able for these forums.

The Property team is considering and the council would like your feedback using the yellow sheets found in the pews during worship on the need for adding additional handicap parking spaces.
