Dear friends in Christ,

As the seasons shift and the air grows crisp, we once again step into a rhythm of worship, study, and community life together. This fall, we return to the beginning—the book of Genesis—and embark on a journey through the Narrative Lectionary. Over the course of the year, we'll move through the entire sweep of Scripture. While we won't read every story, we will trace the grand arc of God's redeeming love: from creation, through the promises to Israel, to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, and into the birth of the church.

This journey is more than an intellectual exercise. It is a chance to be shaped as God's beloved community. The Bible is not just a collection of old stories; it is the story of God's love for people throughout all of history. And it is still unfolding in us today. As we listen, learn, and live these stories, we discover again that we are not just readers of Scripture—we are participants in it. God is still creating, redeeming, and calling.

Our theme this year, God's Beloved Community, reminds us that faith is never meant to be a solitary endeavor. To be God's beloved means not only knowing that you are deeply cherished by God, but also discovering how that love binds us to one another. We live out this identity when we gather for worship, when we study together, when we support one another in times of need, and when we seek the flourishing of our neighbors here in Faribault.

The world around us is hungry for signs of God's presence, for glimpses of belovedness in the midst of loneliness, division, and uncertainty. My prayer is that our congregation would be such a sign. This fall, let's open ourselves to be shaped by Scripture in a way that deepens our faith and strengthens our witness. May we not only learn about God's story, but live into it—so that through us, others may catch sight of the God who calls all people beloved.

I look forward to walking this journey with you.

For the Life of the World

Right in the middle of the hottest time of the year, hundreds of Lutherans from all over the U.S., including myself, traveled to the hottest city in America – Phoenix, AZ. Why, in God's name, would we do such a thing? Well, it's not just because the rates are cheaper when the thermometer hits 115. It was the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly, which happens every three years, and serves as our church body's highest legislative authority. I was elected by our synod assembly last year to serve as one of our synod's voting members. Our charge was to prayerfully discern and make decisions about social statements, memorials (what we would call resolutions), constitutional amendments, a triennial budget, and to elect new leaders, such as churchwide council members, a new secretary, and a new presiding bishop. The work we accomplished will impact all of the 2.7 million members and 8,400 worshipping communities of the ELCA in some way. Our theme was "For the Life of the World" which is a phrase taken from the Nicene Creed that emphasizes how we are called to live and serve for the life and well-being of the whole world. I am sharing a few highlights below. Yehiel Curry, currently serving as the bishop of Metro Chicago Synod, was elected on the fifth ballot to serve as our next Presiding Bishop of the ELCA. He will be the first Black person serving in that role. After having personally met Bishop Curry last year and hearing his passion and ideas for how our churches can serve our communities and embrace increasingly diverse ways of being the church and raising up leaders from diverse backgrounds, I am hopeful for the vision and leadership he will bring. Before serving as bishop, Rev. Curry served as a pastor and mission developer in Riverdale, IL. Before that he served his community as a social worker and then as a teacher.

Lucille "CeCee" Mills was elected to serve as the next Secretary of the ELCA. She will be the first Black woman to serve in this role. Like Bishop Curry, Rev. Mills came to ordained ministry as a TEEM candidate (Theological Education for Emerging Ministries). She currently serves as an assistant to the bishop in the North Carolina Synod.

The social statement "Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust" first adopted in 2009, was updated with revisions to more accurately reflect current church understanding and legal realities.

The social statement "Faith and Civic Life" was presented and adopted.

A number of recommendations were received and adopted from the Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church, which examined purpose and structure of various entities of the ELCA, with a particular emphasis on dismantling racism.

A statement on the *Filioque* was adopted, which reflects decades of dialogue with the Eastern Orthodox churches. This theological statement will hopefully bring us into closer communion with our siblings in the Orthodox traditions.

A number of memorials were debated and approved with amendments, including a memorial that calls on leaders to enact a ceasefire in the Middle East, end Israeli occupation of Gaza and the West Bank, and establish a Palestinian state.

While we weren't always of one mind on every issue, I felt deep unity with everyone through the presence of the Spirit. God was at work in that convention hall in downtown Phoenix, and I sense the Spirit will continue that work in and through all 65 synods and in each congregation. Please keep our newly elected leaders and outgoing leaders in your prayers.

Council Corner

Our Saviors' Council met on Tuesday, August 19th. There was a full agenda to discuss and work through after not meeting in July.

As we transition from summer programming, which included camps, mission trips, Wild Wednesdays, and VBS, to our Fall Programming, we ask students from Pre-K through 12th grade to register by August 31st. Pre-K through 5th graders will have the option of Sundays after worship or Wednesday nights. Confirmation and High School Group will be on Wednesday nights. We will have QR Codes in the bulletins, newsletter, our website, and in the narthex to make registration easy. The first Wednesday of programming will be on September 17th. That same evening, we will honor and celebrate the Putrah family for their generosity in supporting Children's Ministry with the Kathleen G. Putrah Director of Children's Ministry endowment fund. Please stay tuned for further details.

In July, Pastor Kira sent out letters to every household. Those 243 households who have pledged to give in 2025 or have provided financial support received a letter of gratitude, while those 164 households who are members but have not made pledges received a request to consider making a pledge. Our Ministry Spending Plan, approved at the Annual Meeting, still has a shortfall of nearly \$90,000. To break this down, if non-pledged households gave \$29 per week for the rest of the year, we would eliminate that shortfall altogether.

We are working on implementing a QR Code in pews to allow for one-time electronic offerings to the General Fund.

The Council read and discussed chapter 1 of "Anatomy of a Revived Church" called "Accepting Responsibility." We are evaluating how worship and the church have changed in recent years and exploring ways to adapt to cultural and societal shifts to ensure Our Saviors endures for years to come.

To that end, please mark your calendars for Sunday, September 21st, following worship. We will be holding a State of the Church forum to discuss three key topics: the unfilled Business Administrator Position, the current financial update, and the financial trajectory for 2026. We ask that you join the council and pastors for real and perhaps tough conversations as we address some of the opportunities we are facing.

We thank you for the many ways you continue to support the church and its ministry with your gifts, time, and talents. We are grateful for all of you.

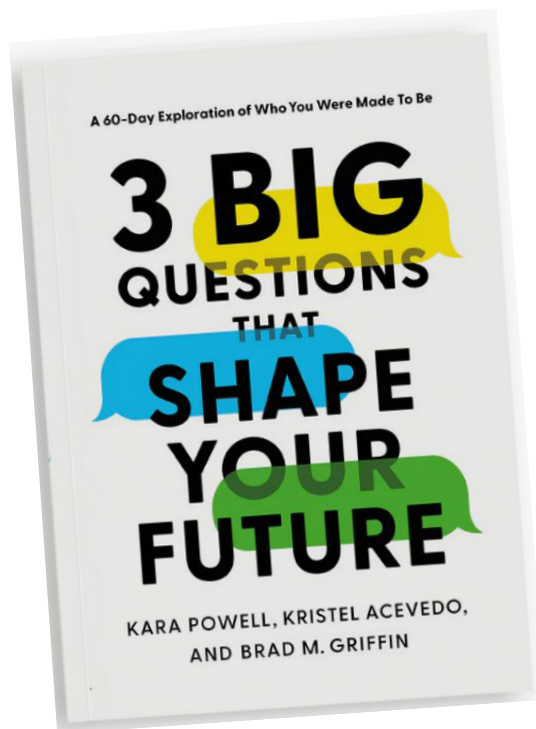

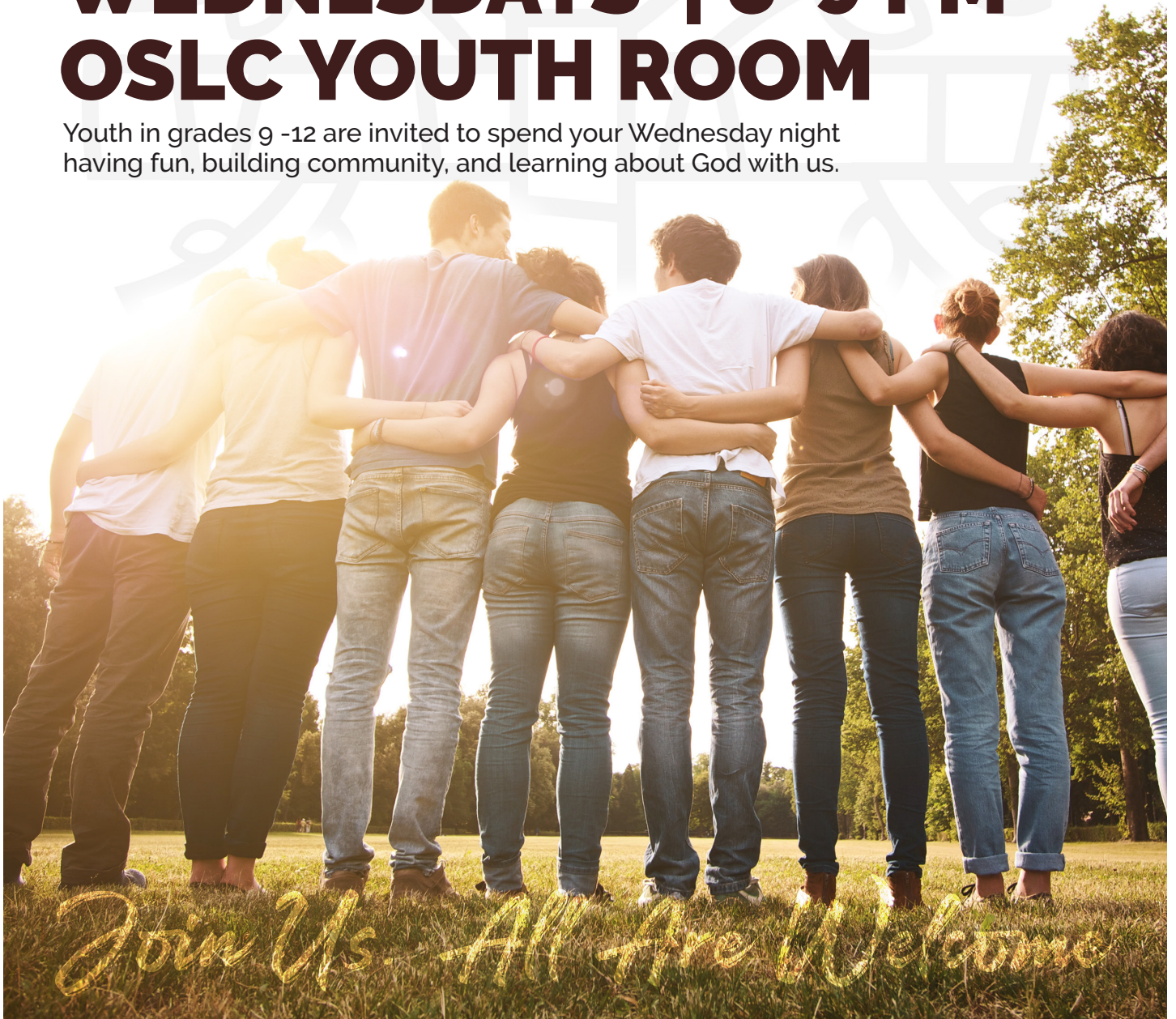
