As we approach All Saint's Day on Sunday, November 2nd, we are reminded of the sacred tradition observed by various denominations, such as the Roman Catholic Church, the Methodist Church, and the Lutheran Church. This day serves as a time to honor and remember those who have departed from this world in the past year offering gratitude for the lives they lived.

In the midst of our collective remembrance, we also acknowledge the individual journeys of grief that each of you may be navigating. Grief is a complex and deeply personal experience, with no prescribed roadmap for its navigation. It ebbs and flows like the currents of the ocean, sometimes gentle and at other times tumultuous, catching us off guard with its intensity.

Throughout the pages of the Bible, we encounter stories of individuals who grappled with profound grief. From Job, who endured unimaginable loss and suffering, to David, who mourned the death of his beloved son Absalom, these figures exemplify the depth of sorrow of the human spirit in the face of grief.

Just as these biblical figures found solace and strength in their faith, may you also find comfort in the knowledge that you are not alone in your grief. Whether you find yourself navigating the daily routines with ease or struggling with unexpected triggers that evoke memories of your loved one, know that your emotions are valued and deserving of compassion.

In my own journey with loss I return often to "The Cure for Sorrow: A Book of Blessings for Times of Grief" by Jan Richardson. This book is a compass for emotions in grief. This month I offer you her poem "Blessing for the Brokenhearted". May you find peace in the love that was and in the memory that remains.

As we come together to honor All Saint's Sunday, may we create space of love and support for one another, holding space for both our individual grief and our collective remembrance.

Gangsters & Angels

For no human will be justified before him by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin. But now, apart from the law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed and is attested by the Law and the Prophets, the righteousness of God through the faith of Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus. Romans 3:10-23, NRSV

I recently had the joy of going to see Mumford & Sons live at the Grand Casino Arena (formerly Xcel Energy Center). The English folk rock band has been a favorite of mine for many years, so most of their setlist that night was very familiar to me. But at the end of their encore, they played a brand new, unreleased song that Marcus Mumford introduced as, "A Conversation With My Son: Gangsters & Angels." It was stunning. The song imagines the singer's child asking a guestion about why the world is the way it is, and the response is, "This is a sad, sad world with a knife at its throat / We're all tumblers and beggars / C'mon, I will show you gangsters and angels / ...We'd rather be ruined than changed and die in our dread." It's a bleak description of the world and of human nature, but the verse ends, "But love your crooked neighbor with your crooked heart / Reach across again / Here's where heaven starts / I end where you begin / With my hand over your heart."

On October 26, we celebrated Reformation Sunday. The most important theological insight to come out of the Reformation is that we are made right with God by God's grace through faith, and not through our own good works. As St. Paul says, "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God," AND, we are also "justified by his grace as a gift." This led Martin Luther to say that each one of us is both "sinner and saint." We cannot separate sinners into one box and saints into another because each baptized Christian is BOTH - 100% sanctified by God AND 100% a sinner in need of God's grace. The math doesn't change in this lifetime, no matter how good and holy you manage to live. Our spiritual journey is one of daily baptism – of dying to our old, sinful selves and rising to new life in Christ, and this is what frees you to "love your crooked neighbor with your crooked heart."

I think we struggle to see the "both/and" nature of people. This has always been the case, but it seems particularly acute in our culture today. There is a collective impulse to condemn and "cancel" those we deem sinners and to sanctify those with whom we agree. We try to define people based on the worst things they've ever said or done, while minimizing the abuse of others and failing to hold them accountable. Often, it's our tribal and political biases that determine which of these two ditches we fall into.

As Lutherans, I encourage us to proudly live into our "both/and" identity in a world that wants to define us in "either/or" categories. We are both Gangsters & Angels, Sinners & Saints. We all have crooked hearts, and yet they are hearts that can love even the most crooked of our neighbors – not because of anything we've done, but because of what Christ has done for us.

So dear beloved sinner, love your crooked neighbor with your crooked heart, and trust in God's mercy. There is no gangster or angel God cannot reach with his love. Thanks be to God.


2026 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN


