Dear Friends in Christ,

It was an ordinary Tuesday. The kind where the alarm felt too early and the coffee didn't feel strong enough. The kind where the calendar was already too full before the day even began. I remember standing at the kitchen counter, lunch half-packed, scrolling through emails, mentally making a list of everything I needed to do. It was loud—not with noise, but with responsibility.

And then, almost without thinking, I stopped. I put my phone down. I placed both hands flat on the counter. I took a breath, and said to myself, "God, help me today." It wasn't fancy. It wasn't poetic. It lasted maybe three seconds. But it changed something for me. Not the schedule. Not the deadlines. Not the responsibilities waiting for me. But it changed something in me. It reminded me that I wasn't walking into the day alone. It reminded me that even in the middle of an ordinary Tuesday, God was present.

Lent is an invitation into that kind of moment.

We often think of Lent as something we add on—one more church service, one more commitment, one more thing in an already full life. But Lent is less about adding and more about making space. It is a season that gently asks: Where is God in your everyday life? And are you making room to notice?

Lent lasts forty days, but it meets us in the small moments we live every single day. It meets us in the quiet of the morning before anyone else is awake. It meets us in the car, between one place and the next. It meets us at the kitchen sink, in the pickup line, on a walk, or in the stillness before sleep. Lent reminds us that faith isn't only something that happens at church. Faith happens in kitchens and cars and hospital rooms and office desks. Faith happens in the middle of real life.

This season, many people choose to give something up. And that can be meaningful. But sometimes the most powerful Lenten practice isn't what we give up, but what we make room for. What if, this Lent, you made room for one small moment with God each day? Not because you have to, but because you need to.

It could be as simple as pausing before your feet hit the floor in the morning and saying, "God, be with me today." Turning off the radio in the car and driving in silence for five minutes. Reading a single verse of scripture and sitting with it. Taking a breath and remembering that you are held by grace.

These moments may seem small. But small moments are where relationships grow. And Lent is, at its heart, about relationship. It is about returning our attention to the God who has never stopped paying attention to us. Martin Luther once wrote that God doesn't need our good works, but our neighbor does. And I would add this: God doesn't need our Lenten practices. But we do. Because they soften us. They center us. They remind us who we are and whose we are.

In a world that constantly asks for more of us, Lent is a season that invites us to be still. To listen. To notice. To return. You do not need to do Lent perfectly. You simply need to be present. Because the good news of this season is not that we find God. It is that, again and again, we discover God has already found us.

This March (for the whole month), my prayer for you is not that you add one more thing to your life. My prayer is that you make space. Space to breathe. Space to pray. Space to notice. Space for God. Even on an ordinary Tuesday. And trust that God will meet you there.

Council Corner

2026 New Year Kick-off Meeting Recap

The meeting brought together staff, Council members, and Table members to reflect on our current standing as a congregation and look toward our future together. The session began with a "Holy Huddle" icebreaker where attendees shared their personal visions for what OSLC needs most right now.

Key Takeaways & Updates:

- **Constitutional Review:** We reviewed the OSLC Constitution (last updated in 2019), focusing on membership classifications and the responsibilities of the Congregation Council. Pastor Kira also noted that the church will be looking closely at current membership rosters.
- **Financial & Resource Overview:** Attendees reviewed the 2026 Ministry Spending Plan and table budgets. All church documents and table resources are now organized on Google Drive for increased transparency and accessibility.
- **Associate Pastor Position Update:** Following a conversation with the Bishop's Office, the Council has decided to pivot our search. Rather than seeking an associate pastor, we will be focusing our efforts on calling a visitation pastor at this time. This decision was made to ensure our leadership structure aligns with current attendance, participation levels, and our 2026 budget.
- **New Care Initiatives:** Council shared its primary goal for the year: to be a welcoming community where every generation has a place to belong. To achieve this, the church will focus on creating intentional small group ministries for all ages and moving members from "a seat in the pews to active involvement".

To support our aging congregation, the Council will explore hiring retired clergy to assist with preaching and congregational care. Pastor Kira expressed feeling well-supported by the congregation during this transition.
- **Table Breakouts:** Each Table (Gather, Root, and Spring) met to review their Charters, elect a Chair and Secretary, and establish their meeting schedules for the upcoming year. Tables are moving toward a goal of three-month vision planning.

The Council remains committed to transparency and hard work as we navigate this new season of ministry together.






