Dear Friends in Christ,

At our recent Faithful Pages book club we discussed *The Red Notebook*, a quiet, charming story about a man who finds a lost handbag and, through its contents, begins to piece together the life of a woman he did not know. What unfolded was a story built on fragments: a notebook, a few objects, scattered clues. From these pieces, he forms a picture of who she might be.

Our conversation that night circling back to one simple but powerful truth: how often do we do the same thing with one another? We meet people in passing. We sit near them in the pews. We exchange greetings in the narthex or hallway. And from these brief fragments of encounter, we begin to form an understanding of who someone is. But the truth is, those fragments rarely tell the whole story.

In the book, curiosity becomes the bridge to connection. The main character chooses not to remain distant or indifferent, but chooses to lean in to wonder, notice, and care. And that choice is what transforms a simple moment into something meaningful, he also goes a little too far, but that's a point for another day.

As we talked together, it raised an important question for us as community of faith:

What might change if we approached one another with that same kind of healthy curiosity? What if we moved beyond the surface-level "hellos" and made space to truly know one another?

Scripture reminds us again and again that we are called into community. In Galatians 6:2, we are urged to "bear one another's burdens," and in Romans 12:15, we are reminded to share in both joy and sorrow. These are not surface-level invitations, what God wants for God's people is that they move beyond fragments and into real relationship. Even 1 Corinthians 12:26 paints a picture of a community so connected that no one's story exists in isolation. This is what it means to be the body of Christ: to listen deeply, to care intentionally, and to hold one another's stories with compassion. We cannot live this out from a distance; it begins by truly seeing and knowing one another.

But it is hard to carry someone's story if we do not know it. To be a community of prayer warriors, we must also be a community of listeners. This doesn't require grand gestures. It might look like lingering a little longer in conversation. Asking one more question. Remembering something someone shared and then following up. It might look like being open enough to share a piece of your own story, trusting that this is a place where you can be known.

Because the truth is, each person who walks through our doors carries a story far richer than the fragments we see on a Sunday morning. To be part of a faith community where those stories are not only heard but held with care is a gift. My hope for us is that we continue to grow into that kind of community: one that is curious, compassionate, and deeply connected. A place where we don't just pass by one another but truly see one another. Stay for coffee after worship long after the sanctuary lights are off and connect! You never know what story someone is carrying or how much it might mean to them for you to take the time to listen.

Council Corner

The Church Council met on Tuesday, April 21.

A few highlights include:

The Finance Committee reported that we are in the best cash reserve place we have been in a long time. *[like pre-Covid days, can I get an Amen?!]* The council passed a motion giving the Finance Committee approval to research savings options with higher interest rates. This in no way means your offering isn't needed; it means we are exploring ways to be better stewards of your gifts while keeping funds easily accessible. *[that's **higher yield** and **liquidity** for the bankers and accountants in the room]*

We are in a good place financially because we are **still short 3 staffing positions**. Council has decided to put together a task force to evaluate our staffing structure. Keep this in your prayers.

The coffee bar has been on the minds of the council and property committee for many months. We need a sustainable way to support a welcoming coffee corner. **Following worship, Pastor Kira & Council President Andrea will be in the lobby with a clipboard for volunteers.**

Continue to pray for the council and table members and their discernment for what is best for the congregation. If you have questions or want to be more involved, contact a council member.

March expenses were down <23.02% > from the Ministry Spending Plan or <-\$14,512.00>, and this was expected due to having open staff positions.

Year To Date - we are Up \$6,018 in Giving and we are Under Ministry Spending Plan by <\$55,131> in Expenses.

Currently we are sitting at a positive \$13,251 for March and \$37,075 YTD on our MSP.

Cash on hand is at \$167,981.80 this puts us in a great position to sustain the fluctuation of when giving comes in.
